In her book <u>Packing for Mars: The curious science of life in the void</u> (2010), Mary Roach examines the effects of being disconnected from the earth. "I once met a man who told me that after landing in Christchurch, New Zealand, after a winter at the South Pole research station, he and his companions spent a couple days just wandering around staring in awe at flowers and trees. At one point, one of them spotted a woman pushing a stroller. "A baby!" he shouted, and they all rushed across the street to see. The woman turned the stroller and ran."

After months surrounded by frozen barrenness, the men were amazed at the simple sights of nature. Roach goes on to explain how an unnatural environment creates in all of us a longing to return to nature. "Nothing tops space as a barren, unnatural environment. Astronauts who had no prior interest in gardening spend hours tending experimental greenhouses. They are our love,' said cosmonaut Vladislav Volkov of the tiny flax plants with which they shared the confines of Salyut 1, the first Soviet space station.

Humans don't belong in space....Weightlessness is an exhilarating novelty, but floaters soon begin to dream of walking. Earlier [Alexandr] Laveikin told us, 'Only in space do you understand what incredible happiness it is just to walk. To walk on Earth."

God gave the earth for us to enjoy and be blessed by it and He also gave us the environment to use as a resource. Animals, plants and minerals provide us with helpful materials for growth and prosperity. However, God never intended for us to abuse these resources. The best modern description of our job assignment is caretaker - a person who is in charge of the maintenance of an area.

God wants us to be caretakers of the environment that surrounds us. He designed it to sustain us: air to breathe, sunshine to warm and heal us, and food and water to eat and drink. God yearns for us to treasure this planet we call home.
