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Principal's Message



It was about 29 years ago that I first became a Junior Academy principal, and after a few successful years on the West Coast, I was offered the opportunity to jump to a small town public school principalship. There were a lot of great reasons to jump. It was close to my childhood home and my parents were anxious to move off of the farm... rent would be cheap. I could farm the home section instead of having dad rent it out, I could keep my cattle, and my children would have a veritable playground with swamps, safe roads to ride bikes and motorized toys on and a vast winter paradise for sledding and snowmobiling. Most importantly, the public seemed to have an inflated value of the job description and I would double my current income. In spite of all these "green lights" my wife saw problems.

You see, we both believed that as a statement of faith, our children needed to enroll at the school where I taught. Furthermore, we saw our church's school system, with whatever problems it may have- lack of resources, less students (occasionally only one or two in a grade), at times not very desirable companions for our children- as the age-old cities of refuge, and the safest alternative for Christian children and had agreed early on that we wanted church school for our children. Shifting gears, I argued valiantly for the new, more lucrative career. "It is elementary school through 9th grade," I would say. "Surely they would be okay in our small country school."

It was around this time, a friend shared the following parable with me. I'm not sure where it came from, or to whom the credit belongs, but I have always understood the value of a good parable. Allow me to share it with you:

A certain man desired to fill his house with solid walnut furniture. Growing on his estate was a growth of choice walnut trees. "Cut down the trees," he directed his servants, "and send them to the mill to be seasoned and sawed and planed." The servants did as they were directed. "Now take this lumber to State Manufacturing Company that it may be made into a cabinet for holding fine china, a table and chairs, and other dining-room furniture of great beauty. When it is finished, I shall have the finest dining room in all the land." "But sir," his servant pled, "State Manufacturing Company does not make dining-room furniture." Irritated, the man commanded, "Quiet! This company has the best workmen, the most up-to-date equipment, the finest and best operated plants in all the country. Do as I say." At length the furniture was delivered, but great was the man's disappointment and grief, for every piece of furniture was a magnificent walnut casket! State Manufacturing only made coffins. If you want dining room furniture, you send it to a furniture manufacturer not to a casket maker. If you want your child to become an engineer you send that child to a school of engineering and not to a Conservatory of music. Or if your child is to be a nurse, a school of nursing and not a business college. Likewise, young people who would serve as Christians get their best training in Christian schools. I understand that freewill eliminates guarantees, but parents, are your children being trained to become active Christians?

I stayed where I was, continued to serve in church school, and we put our children all the way through. Today, occupied in three very different capacities, they love and serve God.

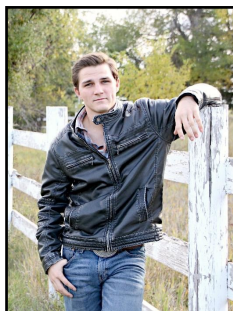

Giving to DAA

Many who give to DAA experience the satisfaction of knowing their gift makes a real difference in the life of a young person. You help “Build Friendships for Eternity.”

Annual Fund

Goal: \$275,000/yr

Gifts to the Annual Fund are unrestricted donations that are valuable to the operation of the school. They contribute to the stability and security of the school program and are applied where the need is greatest.

Worthy Student Fund

Goal: \$125,000/yr

These gifts go to work immediately in assisting students with financial needs. During the 2016-2017 school year, approximately half of our students received assistance from this fund. Support is needed annually, especially in these financially difficult times.

Dorm Renovation

Goal: \$80,000/yr

Our students spend many hours in their dorm rooms throughout the school year. It is their home away from home. Here they study, sleep, relax, and spend personal time in worship. In addition, the dorms are used during alumni weekends, camp meetings, and other special events. \$80,000 will renovate one wing. *One wing in each dorm is completed and in use by our students.*

Gifts-in-kind

Gifts of a non-monetary nature will benefit the school. They enrich programs and capital improvement. Examples would be furniture, landscape materials, library books, or musical instruments.

Special Funds

Donors may give to a variety of programs including music, mission trips, art, basketball, or special projects. These also enrich the quality of the programs offered to our students.

“Touch the Future for Youth” Today

Endowment gifts are a major contribution to the school’s future stability. These gifts, held at the Dakota Conference office, are permanent funds that provide lasting financial resources to DAA and its programs. Invested in interest-earning accounts, the income is used annually for the designated purpose of the endowment. They are a gift that “keeps on giving,” a “lasting legacy.” Dakota Conference currently holds three endowments and a Board-designated endowment which benefit DAA. Each year a portion of the earnings are sent to DAA to help with operating costs or scholarships.

Once a year a special “**secondary education endowment offering**” is taken during the third quarter of the year. Those offerings are sent on to the Conference and added to the current established endowments. **Endowment Sabbath is scheduled for September 22, 2018.** Students and staff will be visiting seven churches around the conference.

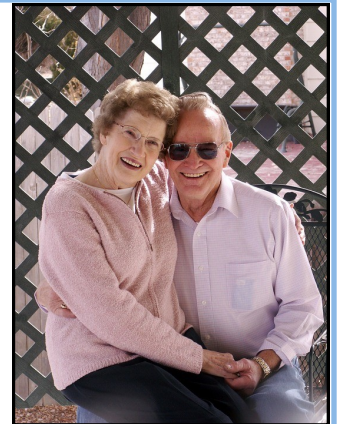

This year is the second year of the program. Recipients are **Jadyn Anderson**, junior from Summit, **Nina Faith**, sophomore from Huron, **Hayden Gronau**, junior from Langford, **Wesley Kayser**, freshman from Aberdeen, and **Karissa Rickard**, junior from Sioux Falls. Each received \$400 towards their education here at DAA.

The scholarship was started with a donation of \$10,851.79 from the PVA alumni and thanks to the generosity of Plainview alumni, an additional \$5,625 has been received in contributions since November 2016. The first year \$1500 was awarded and this year \$2000 was awarded to South Dakota students.
