The year was 1960 and our family had purchased a brand new black and white television to watch the Olympics. We were excited to watch live the amazing athletic feats of our American Olympians, but then something far more sinister came on the screen. Adolf Eichmann had been captured in Argentina by top-secret agents from Israel and flown out by night to stand trial. The innocent world of my



It represented the deadliest assault on Jewish people on American soil and should remind every Seventh-day Adventist that we have a clear message: Bigotry and hatred of any kind is not who we are, for if we hate, we hate Jesus. It also reminds us that Sabbath keepers are not always loved, whether Jew or Adventist.

We, as joint-heirs with Christ, are such only because Jesus is Himself the Offspring and Heir of Abraham (Galatians 3:29). Jesus said before He comes there will be a tremendous amount of hate, but He also said His true disciples would be known as the church that loves.

Once again this past year, the mission spirit of our Dakota Conference constituents was demonstrated with a generous return on material blessings received. 2018 tithe was up 3.7% over 2017, making it the third best year in total contributions out of the last ten - following only the "oil bonanza" years of 2013-14.
