Share Exchange Opened in Community

Two ladies from the Turtle Lake Adventist Church, Judy Boyko and Karen Boyko, have started a community service called



Share Exchange. Judy Boyko said, "When I read, 'If your church closed tomorrow would your community miss it?' I thought about our church. I thought what can we do to be a help in our community so if our doors closed, which we hope will never happens, the community would miss us?"

They sought for a way to fill a need and be a blessing in their small community and were surprised to find a need for clothing. The public school was calling residents for help because children were coming to school with plastic bags over their shoes, as they owned no snow boots. The Turtle Lake Church decided to fill that niche.

The Lutheran Church in Turtle Lake opens two classrooms twice a month, the 2nd Thursday and 4th Saturday, to the Food Pantry but no one was providing clothing to those in need. The *Share Exchange* is open every other Thursday so those traveling in to the Food Pantry may also stop at *Share Exchange*.

The name *Dorcas* was considered, which the Adventist Church has used in years past, and which the Turtle Lake Church had operated for years, but it was decided that that name would not be understood today so Judy proposed the name *Share Exchange*. One decision that was made early on was that the clothing to be distributed would be of a quality that they themselves would wear. Literature is also available as well as personal hygiene packets, which include a toothbrush and paste and a washcloth and soap.



People in the community have embraced their efforts by dropping off clothing and shoes at the church for distribution. Members of the church have also provided clothing and help with setting up and taking down each week.

Erik Christensen made an announcement last Sabbath at the Manfred Church about each person keeping track of the number
