

Dakota Conference Celebrating 145 Years, 1874 - 2019

Goodrich Church History, Part 2

January 23, 1960, the new church had a Door Opening service. Elder R. H. Nightingale, president of the Northern Union Conference, was the morning speaker. The McClusky, Denhoff and Hurdsfield congregations joined us.

Mayor Ed Schauer gave a congratulations on behalf of the city of Goodrich. "Self-determination, cooperation and love were the three main steps in making this building possible." He stated that love was the most important of the three because it is love that prompts both self-determination and cooperation. The beautiful flowers decorating the church rostrum were sent by business men of Goodrich - red roses from the Red Owl store, a basket of pink gladiolas from First State Bank, large chrysanthemums and gladiolas from Mr & Mrs. Paulus, and lavender chrysanthemums from Cash Hardware.

Pastor George Sherbondy introduced the speakers who told of the progress in building the church: Emil Kahler, chairman of the building committee; Sam Renk, elder for the past three years; John Renk, treasurer; Pastor K. D. Johnson; and Pastor S. E. White, president and treasurer of the North Dakota Conference.

In the afternoon, Max Torkelson, superintendent of Sheyenne River Academy, introduced the musical program given by students from the academy. The girls' chorus, directed by Miss Jackie Schimke, rendered two numbers. The talk given by Fred Hauck, Bible teacher, on the love of God was illustrated with musical numbers rendered by a mixed quartet, trios, duets and solos. Miss Marilyn Wheeler was accompanist. Pastor K. D. Johnson presented the last part of the program, *Facing the Future*. Pastor R. D. Steinke, state Home Missionary and Welfare leader, challenged all to great Bible study and service for others. *Spotlight on the Bible,* the theme the young people had chosen for 1960, was presented by Pastor G. D. Brass, state youth leader. G. E. Volsch, manager of the Book and Bible store, Pastor G. C Lucht, of the Minot Adventist Church also had part in the program.

The Goodrich North Dakota Seventh-day Adventist Church Dedication was Sabbath afternoon April 26, 1969 with over 200 present for the service. Clifford Kahler, local elder, welcomed the visitors and the honored guest. Robert Janssen, a former pastor who now pastors the Harvey district, gave the scripture reading and took pictures. Grace Juhl and Audrey Laschkewitsch sang special songs. Leontina Kahler present the history of the congregation going back prior to 1908. The present building is the third location for the Goodrich congregation.

Reuben Beck, North Dakota conference treasurer, told of the congregation's plan to carpet the sanctuary and the foyer and called for the offering which amounted to \$86. J. L. Dittberner, Northern Union Conference president, gave the dedication sermon. W. J. Neptune, present pastor, led as the dedication ceremony was read responsively and Ben Trout, North Dakota conference president, led in the dedicatory prayer and preached the worship hour sermon.

Rosa Axt and Otelia Moser, two charter members, were present for the services. Lydia Laschkewitsch, church pianist, played for the worship and dedication services. In the morning George Zeeb, Sabbath School superintendent, conducted the Sabbath School. Mrs. Edwin Kreiter and her daughter, Elaine, sang a duet and Howard Christenson, lay activities leader, gave the mission story for Sabbath School.

For a time it looked as though water from the melting snows would make the scheduled dedication impossible. However, John Renk, head deacon, cut a hole in the cement floor of the basement and installed his own sump pump. Faithful members worked long and hard cleaning up the damage that the water had done and in making the final preparations for the long-awaited dedication.

Over the next few years the church made improvements and rooms were added in the basement for the young people. We also added a kitchen. In 1973 we put a sign in front to identify the church. A new organ and piano were purchased in 1974. In 1975 we had a float for the bicentennial celebration and did place first of the church floats. In 1983 we put in Roman shades, which were installed by Dallas & Loretta Baumbach. A satellite dish was installed to aid the church and have special Sabbath morning programs. In 1997 a district change was made from Goodrich, McClusky and Hurdsfield to Goodrich, Hurdsfield, Harvey and Manfred. Many members have moved to Bismarck due to retirement and health so the church has become smaller. As of May (2001) we do not have a pastor but hope for one soon. Membership as of today is 38, but we are hopeful for growth.


